Affordable Care Act Primary Care Fee Increase
Reminder of May 31, 2013 Deadline

The Agency for Health Care Administration wishes to remind Medicaid enrolled physicians that the Web portal attestation process and paper attestation form is available for eligible providers.

Physicians are encouraged to visit the Florida Medicaid Web portal page for information on the primary care fee increase. Eligible physicians must self-attest in order to receive the enhanced reimbursement.

Retroactive Reimbursement/Claims reprocessing

Physicians MUST attest on or before May 31, 2013, in order to receive retroactive reimbursement for dates of services beginning January 1, 2013. Physicians who self-attest after May 31, 2013 are eligible for the increase on the first day of the month of self-attestation, and may adjust claims retroactively to the first of the month.

Physicians who complete the self-attestation process prior to May 31, 2013 will be eligible for the rate increase retroactively to January 1, 2013. The Medicaid fiscal agent will complete a one-time reprocessing of claims after May 31, 2013 for dates of service on or after January 1, 2013.

Managed care providers

Providers under Florida Medicaid health plan contracts are eligible for the fee increase. More information will be provided to managed care providers at a later date.
